Purpose

 Voluntary purchase of Supplemental Water from the MWRA to help reduce the stress on the Ipswich River

Project Background

• 1999 Long Term Water Supply Study

Explore possible alternative sources of supply

Permits and Approvals

- November 2003 Town Meeting
- MEPA (Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act)
- Department of Environmental Protection (DEP)
- Water Resources Commission (WRC)
- MWRA
 - Advisory Board
 - Board of Directors
- State Legislature
- Governor

Project Description

- Current water use
 - 2.0 million gallons per day (mgd) on average
 - 3.5 mgd maximum
 - All supplied from Town wells in the Ipswich basin
- Starting in this year (May):
 - 1.0 mgd from Ipswich basin wells (Louanis WTP)
 - Purchase remainder from MWRA (avg. 1.2 mgd)
 - Annually between May 1 October 31
- Maximum amount from MWRA = 219 million gallons per year

Water System Changes


- MWRA Connection is at Woburn/Reading Line
 - Washington Street and Mishawum Road
- Construction needed
 - Control valve installation
 - Electrical and instrumentation equipment installation
- Pattern of water flow in the distribution system piping network will change

Flow Distribution

Green: 0 – 35%
 MWRA Water

Red: 35 – 65%
 MWRA Water

• Blue: 65 – 100% MWRA Water



READING

Possible Water Discoloration

- Caused by change in direction of flow in the pipes
 - Sediments may be disturbed
 - Primarily iron/rust
- Water is safe for drinking and bathing, but may be unpalatable
- Avoid doing laundry until it clears up
- Running the COLD water for several minutes may help
- Town will be conducting proactive flushing as well as spot flushing of the water pipes
- Should clear up in 48 hours

Water Quality

- The Town and MWRA are required to meet all state and federal standards for water quality
 - Testing is done in accordance with all standards
 - Results are published in the annual Consumer
 Confidence (Water Quality) Report

Water Quality Comparison

	MWRA	Town of Reading
Water Source	Surface Water (Reservoir)	Ground Water (Wells)
Hardness/ Mineral Content	Low	Moderate
Temperature	Slightly warmer	Average
	72 deg. F	65 – 70 deg. F

Water Quality (continued)

- Previous issues with the taste and odor of the MWRA water have been addressed
 - Spot Pond Reservoir is no longer used
 - New state-of-the-art treatment facility in Marlborough with ozone disinfection
 - Improves taste and clarity
 - Meets tougher state and federal standards
 - Noticeable improvement in the taste of the MWRA water

When Will this Happen?

- Target date is May 2006
- Actual activation will depend on final construction
 - Piping and equipment being installed at the MWRA service at Woburn/Reading line
