



New OSHA Department

- New position created to comply with new law, effective February 2019
- Requires public entities to provide workplace health and safety standards that are at least as stringent as OSHA
- Will oversee and manage MWRA's comprehensive safety program under one umbrella
- Duties include site safety assessments, data analysis, safety program enhancements, incident response and compliance tracking and reporting





Water Quality




- Continuous monitoring at key distribution sites (Contaminant Monitoring System)
- Routine monitoring in community systems under the Total Coliform Rule








2018 TCR Sampling Locations Fully Served and Partial with Total Coliform Positives





Annual Total Coliform Positives: January through August





• 79.4% complete








Chelsea Creek Headworks Rehab

• 44.5% complete






Southern Extra High Redundancy Project

Wastewater Metering Upgrade

- Temporary metering of unmetered areas underway, complete winter 2019
- Have begun review of current permanent metering locations
- Recommendation on new meter system technology 2019
- Installation 12 months




Total Bonded Indebtedness Trending Downward
